Executive Director's Report

The ongoing roll-out of the DSR / JGC Workforce (paid and unpaid) Development review, in conjunction with the continuing work required to support the priorities of the VWA Strategic Plan, meant that the VWA Board was able to implement a number of operational aspects within the organisation. From a VWA office staff perspective this meant the employment of new staff members to support the areas of planned growth within the sport.

VWA High Performance Review Group (HPRG)

In 2015 the VWA HPRG continued to develop a draft of the national volleyball Foundation, Talent, Elite and Mastery (FTEM) Pathway Model. In May 2015, this document was accepted at a Volleyball Australia Pathways meeting as the model that would be implemented Australia wide.

The HPRG work groups continued their work in the following areas, so as to assist the ongoing development of the pathway and FTEM Model:

- Skill development models and common language
- Sports medicine and physio screening
- Information retention and monitoring

The group also commenced work on the establishment of a volleyball Development program and State Team (Beach and Indoor) pre-requisites for both athletes and coaching staff to be implemented in 2016. In conjunction with this, VWA was successful in applying for a Department of Sport and Recreation (DSR) Grant for \$15,000. This grant will commence in 2016 and provide support to the ongoing development of these exciting programs.

VWA Constitution, Policies & Procedures

The VWA Constitution was ratified at the April 2015 VWA AGM and then formally adopted at the VWA SGM held in September 2015. A number of new policies were developed and agreed by the VWA Board in 2015. They included; the Membership Policy, and a comprehensive Risk Management Policy and Strategy.

VWA Strategic Plan 2014 - 2017

In 2015, the VWA Board continued the implementation and review of the VWA Strategic Plan. This was discussed at length at the VWA Clubs Conference and the list of the 2016 Priority Outcomes was identified.

2015 VWA Clubs Conference

The Volleyball Conference was held on the 19th & 20th September 2015 at DSR. All Clubs and Associations, with the exception of the North West, Mandurah and Bunbury Associations attended.

Contemporary Profile

2015, saw the development and implementation of Phase One (base level) of the Volleyball WA database / CRM in partnership with Strategic partner, Fortix. This 'Base' level involved the transfer and cleaning of the data from VWA's previous database, consultation with clubs and staff, process review and creation of training materials, resulting in a fully functioning database.

Phase Two will be delivered in early 2016 and will provide the CRM functionality, including on-line membership and event entry through a Member Portal and club access to their membership data through a Club Portal.

VWA increased its presence on Instagram, Twitter and Facebook, experiencing a growth in Facebook page likes to 2,352 and 63,062 website visits for the year. Volleyball WA also continued to produce its fortnightly e-newsletter, Volley Voice, which is sent out to a distribution list of 2,833 subscribers, sharing information, updates and good news stories from around the sport.

In 2015, VWA, made the decision to cease working with Project3 on a monthly contractual basis and implemented an ongoing relationship that would be project based. As a result the responsibility for the ongoing Sponsorship & Marketing activities were placed under the remit of the VWA Operations section managed by Helen Shields (nee Webb) as the Operations and Support Manager.

VWA continued to work in partnership with key sponsors during the year and were pleased to deliver the inaugural 'Fortix Volleyball Challenge" in November 2015. Over 20 corporate teams participated, including VWA sponsor Hit 92.9.

The event raised over \$10,000 for partner charities 'Sock it to Sarcoma' and Camp Quality'. The event was a resounding success and has been added to the VWA calendar for 2016.

Volleyball WA also welcomed LJ Hooker – Willetton, Shelley and South Lake to the VWA family as a supporting sponsor.

In addition to existing radio and media partnerships with Hit 92.9 and Sunday Times / Perth Now, VWA and the sport raised additional exposure through WA Weekender, airing a volleyball episode in April. Thanks to Martin Suan, Cole Durant and Shelby Maher for their involvement in front and behind the camera.

Volleyball WA would like to thank the Sponsorship and Marketing Committee for championing and supporting a number of these initiatives.

Inclusive Participation

Following 2014, it became important for VWA to actively engage persons from diverse backgrounds and connect with diverse communities in WA.

At the end of July 2015, through the Inclusive Sports Funding Grant from the Department of Sport and Recreation (DSR), Karen Wickham was employed as the VWA Diversity and Participation Coordinator.

This position is responsible for creating sustainable opportunities for, and increasing participation rates of, people from CaLD backgrounds. This includes integration diversity / engagement strategies within Volleyball WA, including member clubs and associations and increasing knowledge and awareness of the best practice engagement strategies.

Multicultural Programs

VWA connected with Communicare and the Edmund Rice Centre who run DSR funded sporting programs that focus on engaging low participation groups (CaLD, aboriginal and low socioeconomic). Volleyball was added to the list of sports for the first time in Term 4 in both programs.

- A program was run at the Australian Islamic College (Thornlie) for girls only for six weeks. This program culminated in an Interschool Multisport Carnival where 194 students from the Australian Islamic Colleges (Thornlie and Armadale) and Cannington College.
- The Local Parks Volleyball Program was held at the Herb Graham Centre. Four sessions were coached by VWA staff; Cole Durant and Irene Alonso Chartier with a focus on upskilling two youth workers who participated in a Level 2 Coaching Course in November.

Cultural Awareness Education

- VWA staff participated in the Office of Multicultural Interests Diverse WA Online Cultural Competency Training Package as part of their cultural awareness education.
- Volleyball Club and Association officials participated in a Cultural Awareness workshop held at the 2015 Clubs Conference by the Edmund Rice Centre. Free Cultural Awareness Training sessions are now available to clubs.
- Diversity and Engagement Fact Sheets have been circulated to club officials and will continue in 2016.

Sporting Schools

The Australian Sports Commission's Sporting Schools Program officially rolled out in July 2015. Unlike the Active After Schools Program, schools were able to run sports during, before or after school. VWA ran clinics at most of the metro schools requesting Volleyball.

18 Sporting Schools Volleyball Programs (169 sessions with 1087 participants) were

conducted for the year. The online foundation (Level One) coaching course which was developed late in 2015 will enable more coaches, metropolitan and regional, to gain national accreditation to run sporting schools programs in 2016.

Spikezone

Following the 2014 review, a Spikezone Agreement was developed for the volleyball providers. Two providers and four programs continued at the start of 2015; Suburbs Volleyball Northern Academv (Joondalup Indoor, Malaga Indoor, and Greenwood College) and Rossmoyne Volleyball Club. The Malaga Indoor program did not continue in Term 2.

VWA also welcomed Esperance Volleyball Association as a Provider in Term 3 and their program was started in Term 4 at the Esperance Bowls Club with an astonishing 77 participants.

School Clinics

VWA continued to provide school clinics to both primary and secondary schools. In 2015 VWA conducted 95 clinics for 783 participants. 18 Coaches assisted with these clinics. Once again VWA represented by Rachelle Brammer conducted clinics in Christmas Island. Thank you to the Department of Sport and Recreation who provided funding for this visit. In 2016 a further visit is planned to both Christmas Island and Coco Island.

School Sport WA (SSWA)

VWA and SSWA continue to build a strong relationship with Lynda Merritt an appointed member of the VWA Junior Committee. The VWA calendar provides information for all SSWA competitions, with volleyball being the largest represented sport at their SHS competition held each June. Congratulations to Albany SHS who won both the male and female volleyball trophies. In conjunction with School Sport WA, VWA provides a coaching clinic for the volleyball schools that attend the DHS competition.

Quality Events

VWA and its affiliate clubs and associations provide numerous opportunities for the volleyball community in Western Australia including;

- The VWA Annual Awards Dinner was held on the 19th September at City West Receptions in West Perth. Representatives from all codes of volleyball attended the gala evening.
- The Annual Clubs and Association Conference was held on the 19t^h and 20th of September with representatives from clubs, associations and Indoor Beach Federation attending.
- The Regional Volleyball Associations hosted numerous volleyball competitions and events. For further information please refer to the Clubs and Associations section of the VWA Annual Report.
- The Indoor Beach Federation provided weekly competitions for social through to Super League level competitors at all eight of their Club venues. They also provided numerous school programs.
- Volleyball WA provided competitive competitions in the following codes;
 - Beach (VWA Alcohol. Think Again Beach Volleyball Tour including Juniors, Masters, Mised Doubles and Schools, Western Australian Junior Beach Volleyball League)
 - Indoor (WA Volleyball League [WAVL] including Masters Divisions, Western Australian Junior Volleyball League). In 2015 VWA piloted a four week women's league on Fridays nights.

Think Again Beach Volleyball Tour. 2015 / 2016 saw the continuation of the effort invested over a three year period and the vastly improved delivery of the tour.

Four Level Two Coaching courses (previously Level One) saw 81 participants receive their National Accreditations.

11 Referee Courses were conducted in for 206 participants.

However, VWA was heavily involved in the content development, testing and trialing of the new Level One on-line coaching course which will be introduced in January 2016. An additional focus for 2015 was the development of volleyball Professional Development sessions for teachers which will commence in January 2016.

With both the on-line course and the teacher professional development sessions

in place, 2016 will see volleyball guidance and education being provided to teachers and CaLD providers in Western Australia.
